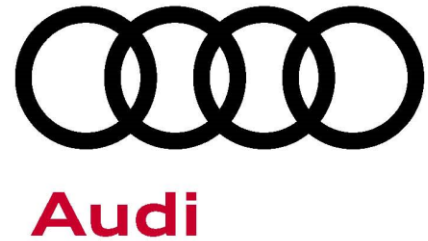

NOTICE OF RACE - AMENDMENT No.1

Para 3 – Eligibility and Entry – delete f.4 and replace with the following:

“For all Entrants a valid Manufacturer Declaration issued by the IJ70CA is required”

Para 6 – Event Format – delete and replace with the following:

6 EVENT FORMAT

- a. A Qualifying Series shall be used to determine a boat's place in the Gold (Championship) or Silver fleets.
 - 1 The qualifying series will be a round robin whereby entrants are divided into four groups, each with a similar number of boats.
 - 2 Assignment of groups shall be determined by the International J/70 Class Association and the OA.
 - 3 Six Qualifying races are planned over the first two days and a minimum of 3 races are required to establish Gold and Silver fleets.
 - 4 Scores for the Qualifying series shall be the total of a boat's scores, excluding a boat's worst score if there are 5 or more races. The first half of the fleet shall race in the Gold fleet for the World Championship; the second half shall race in the Silver fleet. In case of uneven number of boats, the Gold fleet will be bigger by one boat.
 - 5 If a minimum of 3 qualifying races are completed in the first two days the scores from the Qualifying series will be dropped and all competitors will start the Championship events with zero points.
 - 6 If it takes more than two days to complete 3 qualifying races then all scores will carry over into the Championship series.
- b. The Race Committee may use a 3 boats starting line as further described in the Sailing Instructions.
- c. A maximum of 3 races on any day may be sailed, for a maximum of 15 races for the regatta.
- d. No warning signal for a race will be made after 1430 on Saturday, 16th September.

13 SCORING

13.1 The Low Point Scoring System, RRS Appendix A4, will be used except as modified below.

13.2 Qualifying Series

- a. When 5 or more races are completed in the Qualifying Series, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- b. Three races are required to be completed to constitute a Qualifying Series.

13.3 Championship Series starting on Thursday 14 September

- a. If Championship Series starts on Thursday all Qualifying series scores will be discarded.
- b. When 5 or more races are completed in Championship Series, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

13.4 Championship Series starting after Thursday 14 September

- a. If Championship Series starts after Thursday 14 September, all Qualifying series scores will be carried forward and included in Championship series score total.
- b. When 6 or more races are completed in Championship Series, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores (Qualifying and Championship) excluding her worst score.

17. DIVING AND CLEANING

Diving inside and outside the harbour is forbidden by law. Cleaning the boat is authorized without getting in the water. Infringement of this requirement will cause disqualification from the Championship. No diving activities will be allowed and where requests to check hull damage controls or other reasons it shall be authorized by the RC. Only the Harbour master's divers, available on VHF Channel 9, are authorised to dive inside the harbour.
