

RC44 Porto Cervo Cup 2017

The RC44 Porto Cervo Cup 2017 is organised by the Yacht Club Costa Smeralda in conjunction with the RC 44 Class Association. The Event is sanctioned by the Italian Sailing Federation as the National Authority to World Sailing.

The event will be sailed in the waters of Porto Cervo between 29th June and 2nd July 2017. The regatta headquarters will be located at the YCCS.

NOTICE OF RACE

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*. For the match racing, Appendix C of RRS will apply.
- 1.2 FIV Prescriptions 2, 4, 5, 6, 9, 10 and 11 apply. All the Italians competitors shall be FIV members and have a valid medical certificate.
- 1.3 The Equipment Rules of Sailing will apply.
- 1.4 The RC 44 Class Rules, the RC44 Sailing Instructions, the RC 44 Class Association Constitution and the RC44 Annual Championship Rules will apply.
- 1.5 English shall be the official language of the Regatta.

2. ADVERTISING

RC44 championship Tour 2017 Rule 9 will apply. For Italian boats only, the "*Normativa 2017 per l'esposizione della pubblicità nelle manifestazioni veliche in Italia*".

3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 The race is open to all boats of the RC 44 class that comply to the obligations of the class rules, RC 44 Class Association regulations and their National Authorities in the case that a National Authority exists.
- 3.2 All the RC44 teams who did pay their annual class fee are automatically registered to all the event of the RC44 Championship Tour. A team who doesn't want to join an event shall inform the Class Office minimum 6 weeks before the beginning of the race.
- 3.3 Only new crewmembers or owners will have to weigh-in at registration.
- 3.4 Each team is allowed to register 3 on board non-commercial guests per event. The registration shall be sent to the Class Office (hubert.detrey@rc44.com) four weeks before the beginning of the race.
- 3.5 For Italian boats only:
 - FIV cards and a valid medical certification for Italian competitors only
 - Valid FIV authorization to display advertising on boat (if present)

4. CLASSIFICATION

- 4.1 The World sailing (WS) Sailor Classification Code will apply. The skippers are responsible for their team registration to WS and shall send a copy of the classification certificate of each crew (including himself) with the entry form. Skippers shall provide the WS Sailor ID for each crew at registration. Skippers can register their crew on the WS website www.sailing.org.
- 4.2 For full information regarding the crew limitations, see class rules section C "Conditions for racing".

5. FEES

No Entry Fee is required.

- 6.2 Fleet Racing Series: Maximum four races per day are scheduled. Short coastal races can be scheduled, depending on weather conditions. No initial warning signal will be made after 15h30 on Sunday, July 2nd (last day of racing).
- 6.3 In cooperation with the class, the OA may change the format, terminate or eliminate any round, when conditions do not permit the completion of the intended format.

The final programme will be available for competitors upon final registration.

7. MEASUREMENT

- 7.1 Each boat shall have a valid measurement certificate.
- 7.2 The Organisers may weight, measure or inspect any boat and/or her sails and equipment before, during or after the races. There will be no facilities for initial sails measurement. Each boat shall sail with measured sails (initial measurement at the sail loft) and comply with the class rules and sail stickers regulations.

8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS & APPENDICES

The sailing instructions and all the appendices will be available on June 27th at registration.

9. VENUE

The venue will be at the Yacht Club Costa Smeralda in Porto Cervo Marina. Racing area will be in the waters of Porto Cervo. A detailed map of the racing areas is available in the event Guidebook.

10. COURSES

The course to be sailed will be windward-leeward configuration. Spreader marks and leeward gates shall be used. Short coastal races may be scheduled depending on the weather conditions.

11. SCORING

- 11.1 The Low Point System of Appendix 'A' will apply to the fleet racing series.
- 11.2 Two races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 11.3 Each boat's score shall be the total of her race scores. No score will be excluded.

12. SUPPORT BOATS

Support boats shall be identified with a team flag (min size 40x60cm).

13. LAUNCHING AND BERTHING

- 13.1 All boats are to be afloat and moored by 14:00 on June 28th.

- 13.2 Boats shall be kept on the assigned pontoons in the harbour.
For all Participants the mooring place will be available from 12:00 on Monday June 26th to 12:00 on Monday July 3rd.
- 13.3 To reserve moorings prior and after the dates indicated in par.13.2, please send your mooring requirement to secretariat@yccs.it. The YCCS Race Office will take care to inform the Marina Harbour Master accordingly.

- 13.4 Local regulations require that all boats MUST inform the Harbourmaster's Office by radio on VHF Channel 9 when they first arrive in Porto Cervo and each time they leave or enter the Harbour thereafter. When moored, it is MANDATORY for all Participants to visit the Harbourmaster's Office to finalize their registration procedures.
- 14. HAUL-OUT AND DIVING RESTRICTIONS**
- 14.1 Boats shall not be hauled out during the regatta unless approved in writing by the OA.
- 14.2 Diving inside and outside the harbour is forbidden. Only the Harbour master's divers, available on VHF Channel 9, are authorised to dive inside the harbour.
- 15. RADIO COMMUNICATION**
- 15.1 A boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.
- 15.2 Race information will be given by VHF radios. The VHF channel will be confirmed in the SI.
- 16. PRIZES**
The prizes will be given as follows: Trophy to the winner of the fleet racing series
- 17. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY**
- 17.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4 Decision to Race.
- 17.2 The owner/competitor is entirely responsible for his own safety, whether afloat or ashore, and nothing, whether in the notice of race or sailing instructions or anywhere else, reduces this responsibility.
- 17.3 It is for the owner/competitor to decide whether the boat is fit to sail in the conditions in which they will find themselves. By launching or going to sea, the owner/competitor confirms that boat is fit for those conditions and the crew is competent to sail and compete in them.
- 17.4 Nothing done by the organisers can reduce the responsibility of the owner/competitor nor will it make the organisers responsible for any loss, damage, death or personal injury, however, it may have occurred, as a result of the owner/competitor taking part in the racing. The organisers encompass everyone helping to run the race and the event, and include the organising authority, the race committee, the race officer, patrol boats and beach masters.
- 17.5 The provision of patrol boats does not relieve the owner/competitor of her responsibilities.
- 17.6 RRS 68 is changed and replace with:
1. Any claim for damages arising from an incident while a boat is bound by The Racing Rules of Sailing shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the courts and not considered by a protest committee.
2. A boat that takes a penalty or retires does not thereby admit liability for damages or that she has broken a rule.
- 18. INSURANCE**
The boat is required to hold adequate third-party insurance with a minimum cover of € 4.000.000,00 per event or the equivalent if expressed in other currency, and it is the owner or owner's representative's sole and inescapable responsibility to ensure that the insurance is in place and is adequate.
- 19. PHOTOGRAPHS AND TV RIGHTS**
By participating in the RC44 Porto Cervo Cup 2017 a competitor will automatically grants to the Organising Authority and the Class Association the right in perpetuity to make use of and show, at their discretion, any motion pictures, still photographs, live or taped film or video on television and/or other media, showing him/her during the period of the competition, as well as to use such contents in any media whatsoever, for either editorial or advertising purposes or to be used in press information without compensation.
